LIAISON WITH PARENTS

This school has an Open Door Policy and encourages parents to take an active part in their child's education and school activities and events.

The school seeks to inform parents of school activities through Parent/ Teacher Interviews in November and February, Individual Education Plans (as necessary throughout the year), Questionnaires, a September 'Meet the Teacher' Parents' Meeting, an Annual School Report - issued in June 2019, new parent induction days and other specific school events including Book Fairs, Coffee Morning and Sports Day.

The P7 parents were given guidance on the transfer procedure. Annual SEN reviews are conducted with parents, SENCO and relevant teachers.

PTA

This year the school asked the PTA to help purchase replacement interactive boards for the classrooms in the school and new school ties for the P7 leavers. A great team of parents, staff and pupils enjoyed a year of fundraising activities, which included designing Christmas cards and mugs and creating memorable events such as a Glow Party, a very successful Christmas Fair complete with Santa's Grotto, a Class Coin Collection, an Easter Hop'N'Bop and a Popcorn, Pictures and Pyjamas Night. We were very pleased that they raised a total profit of £5,722.23, which covered the cost of purchasing four airpots to assist with catering events at the school, the leavers' ties and two interactive Imex boards.

We look forward to seeing what can be achieved in the year ahead. All parents are very welcome to come along to meetings which usually take place on the first Thursday of each month in the P7 classroom between 7-8pm.

The PTA continues to be a member of Parentkind and is still waiting to be called forward by the Charity Commission to formally register as a charity.

NEWSLETTER AND WEBSITE

The Orchard County Newsletters and school website continue to provide daily information which celebrates school achievement and prepares families for all activities.

Our school website, which was established with School Web Design for the main school and nursery, enables you to view pupils' class activities which are regularly displayed. Information/forms/menus/letters are also available for parents.

The school app can be downloaded on to parents' devices to aid effective communication. Messages and emails can be sent directly to parents.

CROSS PHASE - LINKS WITH LOCAL SECONDARY SCHOOLS

Staff from local Secondary Schools visited the school and spoke to P7 pupils. P7 pupils also visited local Secondary Schools for a musical, activity based days and Open Nights.

THE CURRICULUM

The Governors are confident that Orchard County Primary School continues to provide a safe, secure and stimulating learning environment and offers a great variety of learning opportunities suitable to the needs of each pupil. Staff expertise and resources are well utilised to assist each child as they strive to reach their maximum potential. Due to reduced government and EA finance, the staff attended fewer courses organised by RTU, CCEA, ETI, the EA and other agencies but they have still been able to keep up to date with the ongoing changes and developments within education via online training and Shared Education courses.

The staff continues to engage in a range of strategies to support under achievers in both literacy and numeracy. Additional SEN support was again given both individually and in groups alongside Reading Partnership Sessions and Literacy support from a teacher within the EA's Literacy Peripatetic Service.

ACHIEVEMENT

Academic progress has been maintained on every level and our reports reflect a school where the vast majority of children appreciate the importance of striving to always give their best. Our high level of good manners and respect for others has always been maintained and most importantly, both inside and outside the classroom, pupils have further developed the excellent name of Orchard County Primary School.

All classes have been involved in leading whole school assemblies and parents are very welcome to attend when their child's class is leading assembly.

REVIEW OF THE YEAR

- 2018/19 was a very busy year in the life of Orchard County. There was great success in and out of the
 classroom this year. As usual the children have had the opportunity to take part in a wide range of after
 school activities: hockey, netball, football, rugby, tennis, badminton, cross country, ICT, Eco, craft,
 cookery, choir, knitting, kidercise and guitar clubs. The girls and boys took part in numerous
 tournaments.
- The year started with a brilliant coffee morning organised by the P7 pupils and raised £1,333 for **MacMillan Cancer Care**. This is always so well supported and is a great school and community event.
- In term 1 Mrs McCluskey trained the P6/7 pupils for the Flahavan's Primary School Cross Country League trials and one of our P7 pupils brought home a bronze medal.
- In October we were delighted to receive our second Green Flag Award.
- In October we also enjoyed a brilliant Glow Party organised by the PTA.
- In November we had our annual school bookfair and, with the commission, we were able to add £700 worth of books to our Accelerated Reader Scheme.
- Two of our old white boards were replaced with two new Interactive panels. One of these was funded by our fantastic PTA. The PTA also organised a very successful Christmas Fair in December which was a great community event and raised over £2000.
- We have also been supporting local charities this year. In December we had a Christmas Jumper Day and raised £200 for Save the Children. In February we had a whole school fitness day, combining our fundraising with Mrs McCluskey's fundraising (from running the London Marathon). We were able to present £2350 to the Air Ambulance.
- In January four P7 pupils represented Orchard County PS very well at the ABC NI Primary School Road Safety Quiz.
- In March we had a fantastic World Book Day. Teachers read stories to other classes. We also had a book swap.
- Some P6 and P7 pupils represented school at the K'nex Challenge in March and again in June at the University of Ulster.
- In March we had another great PTA event, the coin collection which raised £420.
- In April, our choir again took part in the Portadown Music festival and won the Gertrude Magee cup for 1st in hymn singing and were 2nd by one point for the two contrasting pieces.
- In April we had a very successful Outdoor Education week. We had animals visiting, tractors in the
 carpark and made some fantastic scarecrows that guard the school and our beautiful grounds. We were
 delighted to have Davison's Simply Puddings in demonstrating how to make their beautiful desserts.

- 34 P7s attended a three day residential at the **Share Centre**, Lisnaskea. The pupils participated in a range of outdoor activities. Special thanks to Mrs McMillan, Mr Crawford and Miss Barnes who gave up their time to accompany the pupils on the trip.
- Nursery Getting ready to Learn Project. This year our Nursery was successful in receiving funding
 as part of the 'Getting Ready to Learn Project. Nursery pupils and parents were able to avail of
 resources such as the Big Bedtime Read and Happy Healthy Kids.

• Sport

Rugby- The boys took part in the Primary School Development Blitz, Gilpin Fun Blitz and the Shelbourne Fun Blitz. The team also visited the Kingspan Stadium and met some of the Ulster/ Irish rugby players.

Swimming- P6/7 attended swimming lessons in term 2 and 3 and we participated in the Small Schools' Swimming Gala. Some of our pupils also represented our school at Schools' Championships.

Football- boys and girls participated in a number of tournaments this year with the boys getting runners up in the Richmount tournament.

Hockey- the girls enjoyed participating in a number of tournaments this year.

Netball- the girls again took part in the ABC Netball league and reached the cup section on finals day.

The Governors would like to thank the staff for all their efforts in training the pupils and taking them to the many tournaments.

- P7 entered the Eason's Spelling Bee competition and one of our P7 girls represented our school at the Co Armagh final.
- P7 also entered the Rotary Writing competition and again we had a P7 girl winning her category with her brilliant story.
- The school was awarded the runner up prize in the Southern Primary Schools' Section of the Best Kept School Award.
- There was another very successful P5 Musicial Pathways concert in June.
- A great sports day was organised and all pupils achieved really well.
- Shared Education The partnership with St Patrick's PS continued in its second year. All pupils from P1-P7 were involved. The pupils enjoyed many trips and we were able to purchase many new resources through the funding provided. The year finished with a special celebration day to showcase the projects.
- Miss Leonard shared the Roots of Empathy programme with P5/6.

School Development Plan

Following a staff audit, a School Development Plan and detailed Action Plans for 2018-19 were discussed, agreed and presented to the Board of Governors. Link Governors met with subject co-ordinators as they shared their action plans for Year 2 of the School Development Plan to bring about improvements. The plan is amended during the three years to take account of the changing needs of the school.

School Policies

The staff, in consultation with pupils, parents and governors, has produced a wide range of pastoral care and curriculum policies that are suited to the needs of current legislation, good practice and the Revised Curriculum. This year the following policies were reviewed - Safeguarding, Complaints, Twitter, GDPR/Privacy Policies, Extreme Weather, Code of Conduct, Fire Safety, Personal Care, Allergies and Anaphylaxis, Mobile Phone, and Whistle Blowing.

Governors, parents, pupils and school staff have been consulted on all of these.

School Council

Two pupils from each class (P4-7) formed the School Council. They met on a number of occasions throughout the year. They discussed various issues and came up with ideas to improve school life for all pupils. They organised rotas for watering plants, picking litter and raising funds for school.

School House Reward System

This year the House Reward System continued, based on a number of different challenges eg good manners, good work and behaviour. Pupils were able to earn tokens for their house and work towards a termly prize.

ASSESSMENT

Due to an ongoing dispute over assessment in Primary Schools, Teaching Unions have recommended that schools do not report levels to the Department of Education. Pupils' individual levels were reported to parents of P4 and P7 pupils.

Pupils in P3-P7 completed Standardised Assessments in English, Mathematics and CAT (intelligent tests) during term three. Parents were informed of the outcome of all assessments at the end of year written report. The majority of standard assessment was completed online.

Attendance

The school actively discourages parents from removing children from class during term-time and we acknowledge parental support in the school's excellent 96.2% attendance rate for Nursery to P7 for 2018/2019.

Punctuality

Punctuality continues to be good for the vast majority of children and we commend both parents and pupils for this. Unfortunately, there are a small number of pupils who regularly arrive late and this is not only detrimental to their own learning but also disrupts the education of others. Picking children up promptly at collection times is also essential to the smooth running of the school. Parental cooperation is greatly appreciated.

REVIEW OF THE YEAR

The 2018/2019 calendar was again action-packed and busy. The pupils have been provided with a wide variety of opportunities and experiences. The Governors wish to record their appreciation to the staff who provide these experiences for all pupils.
