Christmas. We are going to organise a collection for a local foodbank, linked to the Vineyard Church in Dungannon. They have a weekly foodbank and are also donating hampers to those in need this Christmas, following referrals from social workers and various other organisations. They have launched the 'Outward



Focused Christmas' appeal (you can look this up on Facebook or their website for more information). This appeal supports many struggling households and last year 597 food and gift hampers were distributed to people genuinely in need. They have asked us to donate tins of tuna or tins of beans for their hampers this year as there is a lack of protein based food. If

you would like to donate one of these items, please send it in with your child by **Thursday 10th December**. They have also asked that if we have any families in our own school community who think they would benefit from this service or if you know someone else who would, please send me an email and I will pass the details on. I think its lovely for our children to know they are helping local people in need.

We know some children like to give their teacher or classroom assistant a gift at Christmas, this is very much appreciated and not expected at all. The staff would be very happy this year if you donated to the food bank or the Alzheimer's charity that we are supporting this month instead.

Cards - Each year P7 run a Christmas card collection and delivery service. This year it will be slightly different. Children may bring cards in by Friday each week, these will be kept over the weekend in their class box and distributed the following Monday. Please ensure all cards have first name, surname and class on them.

Christmas Performances

Due to Covid-19 restrictions, we are unable to have a whole school nativity play, performance or community carol service this year. Instead, each class bubble will be producing their own simple class Christmas performance. The children are all working hard, learning lines and practising their singing. They will be so proud to share their performances with you via our website, week beginning 14th December.

Shared Education

I am pleased to inform you that we are going to be involved in Year 4 of the CASE Shared Education Project with St. Patrick's PS, Annaghmore and our nursery will be partnering with Apple Blossom playgroup again. A letter was sent to P1-7 parents earlier this week (available to read on the school website) with details of our Shared Education programme for this year and nursery parents will get more details of their programme soon. Please read this letter carefully. Only reply by email if you **do not** consent to your child participating in the SE programme this year.

Unlike previous years, the shared lessons will take place virtually and through C2k approved interactive conferencing platforms such as Google Classroom and Google Meet rather than face-to-face contact at each other's schools. Your child's class teacher will deliver all activities and all interaction, via virtual means. The schools will receive financing to run the programmes. Each child involved is required to have 30 hours shared teaching and learning with children from the other school to qualify for the funding.

PTA

Free School Meals- Please remember if you are entitled to a free school meal apply through the Education Authority.

Parents can apply if your son or daughter is in full-time education and if you are in receipt of one of the following benefits: - Income Support; Income Based Jobseeker's Allowance; Income Related Employment and Support Allowance; Guarantee Element of State Pension Credit; Child Tax Credit or Working Tax Credit with an annual taxable income of £16,190 or less; Universal credit and have net household earnings not exceeding £14,000 per year. If eligible, your child does not have to take FSM everyday.
