Covid/sickness updates



Please continue to look out for Covid symptoms. Symptoms we are currently seeing in school are sore throats, lethargy, cold symptoms, sore eyes and stomach upsets. We have also had cases of pupils being reinfected and children testing positive with no symptoms at all. Please continue to check your children with regular lateral flow tests

and isolate if they get a positive result. You may want to avail of the lateral flow tests kits that can be ordered via the following link- Order lateral flow tests. If your child is displaying symptoms you should book a PCR test for them and isolate while you await the results.

We have a limited number of boxes of lateral flow test kits in school, if you would like to collect a box or have a box sent home with your child, please email or telephone Mrs McCluskey in the school office jmccluskey773@c2kni.net

Many of the cases we have had in school, seem to be affecting the whole family. Please be vigilant and we **really appreciate** those families that have decided to isolate all their children, if Covid is in their home. This is preventing the spread of Covid, from their family, to other pupils and staff in school.

If your child is feeling unwell with Covid symptoms or other illnesses please **do not send them to school**, as unwell pupils can spread viruses to other pupils in their class and staff. Absent staff could mean a class closure, if we are unable to get substitute staff.

The staff will continue to provide work packs or daily activities via Google Classroom, or the school website, for those children who are isolating due to Covid and are well enough to work from home. Please request this from your child's teacher or via the school office. We do not expect children who are ill to be completing work. Please remember that the class teacher may be still teaching a class, so it will be later in the afternoon before they would be able to post tasks for individual pupils isolating.

Uniform

The education minister has stated that opening windows is the most effective way of ventilating classrooms. We have the windows in all

classrooms and the hall open, to allow ventilation throughout the day. Our heat is on (apart from today as we have had a problem with the boiler, hopefully this will be resolved this afternoon) and most of it therefore disappears out the window. On cold days there can be a noticeable drop in the temperature in the classroom. It might be a good idea to put an extra layer underneath pupils' shirts, a thermal, skin or t-shirt and tights for girls would be advisable. Pupils may also wear their school hoodie or their school coat, in class, over their school jumper if they need to on cold days. The staff have also been putting on extra layers.

After School Activities

Due to the expected rise in Covid cases and the difficulties with the January weather, we did not plan any after school activities for January/early February.

In term one we tried our best to have our afterschool activities outside, trying to limit the spread of infection while playing sport.



We also wanted to limit the number of visitors/coaches in school over Jan/Feb and we predicted a drop in staffing due to Covid at the start of the year. We have had a significant number of pupil Covid cases and a lot of staff absence, so our forward planning was a good decision.

We hope to start our after school activities programme again after half term. Due to Covid restrictions, we are not able to arrange hockey, football and netball matches

against other schools yet, we hope this will return late term 2/3. We were delighted that the children were still able to compete at the cross country

competition.

Pupils are still getting a wide variety of activities during their PE time in their class bubbles and are participating in the daily mile scheme and swimming (P5-7).

We endeavour to do our best to keep classes open with sufficient staff. This is very difficult, as substitute staff are very hard to find at the moment and all schools are experiencing the same problems. I am very grateful to our staff, who have covered for each other in many ways and have taken on other jobs/roles to keep our school open and operational for pupils. Our aim will always be to try to keep pupils in school but when cases in P1 increased to 50% of the class testing positive, we had to move to remote learning to try to keep our school community safe. This is difficult for the staff and I am very grateful to them for the many hours they put in preparing work for children who are isolating.

Menu changes

There have been a number of disruptions to deliveries in the kitchen but the staff are doing their best to cook what is on the menu each day. There have also been staff absences in the kitchen but we are thankful that they have still managed to provide a hot meal for our pupils every day.

Will take place week 7th-11th March. We will be in touch with further information about the format of these nearer to the time.


ParentPay
