NUT FREE SCHOOL

Please remember we have a number of pupils in school with nut allergies. It is therefore important that NO child brings NUTS or products containing nuts into school.

SCHOOL MEALS

School meals cost £2.60 per day and £13 for a full week. Cheques should be made payable to Education Authority - Southern Region. Please ensure that all dinner money is paid on a Monday for the week ahead, unless your child is absent. Money can then be sent in when your child returns. If your child/children are entitled to Free School Meals, please ensure that you complete the forms as soon as possible (even if you don't intend taking FSM every day). For more details or to download an application form please visit (www.eani.org.uk/i-want-to/fsm/) This makes a difference also to our school budget.

SCHOOL ARRIVALS AND PICK UP

Please remember pupils should **not** be left on school grounds before **8.40am**. Parents can walk their children to the black gates at the front or back each morning and then encourage them to continue to their relevant door on their own. P1 parents may still be coming to the P1 cloakroom door at this stage but please try to make the drop off as quickly as possible to avoid pupils becoming upset, they do settle very quickly. Mornings are a very busy time for teachers and they are not available to chat with parents at this time. Please pass on important messages through the office or by a note to your child's teacher. School starts at 8.50am, so please try to have your child at school before this time so they can enter their class by the appropriate door and get ready and settled for the day ahead. The staff have noticed that pupils who arrive late and have to enter by the front door become upset as they are not ready and settled like the rest of the class.

PARKING

Please drive carefully and park in the designated parents' parking area in front of the MUGA. No parents should be parking in the school kitchen carpark unless they have obtained permission, this is for kitchen staff only and delivery vehicles. Please leave the bus stop clear and do not double park along the front of the school, beside the disabled spaces. This causes great difficulty for the bus driver who needs clear access to enter and exit the car park on time. The lowered kerb area in front of the nursery is an ideal place for dropping pupils off, please do not park over this area or leave your car here unattended. There are two allocated disabled parking spaces for those who genuinely need them. Thank you for your assistance with this.



HEAD LICE

Please check your child's hair regularly using a special nit comb and treat if necessary. We have already had some reported cases of head lice. Long hair should be tied back.
